Table Talk – Neutralizing the Satan

רבי יצחק teaches in Rosh Hashana (16 a-b) that we are תוקעין אומריעין both prior to davening מוסף and then again during תפלת stor one purpose: כדי לערבב השטן. When the שטן observes the Jewish people blowing the Shofar, his every attempt of indictment becomes nullified due to his confusion and perplexed state. But one must ask, isn't the wo's very function to be against the Jewish people specifically when they are fulfilling the 'רצון by learning Torah and performing Mitzvos? How could he suddenly be baffled by our good deeds at the very time he is called to prosecute the Jewish people? Both the הפלאה and רבי עקיבא איגר found the answer to this question in the carefully chosen words of Rashi. He explains: כשישמע ישראל" "מחבבין את המצות מסתתמין דבריו. Freely translated: when the שטן hears and witnesses that Mitzvos are cherished and beloved by the Jewish people, his every claim is quashed. Rashi stresses the love, devotion and passion the Jews have in their fulfillment of Mitzvos.

When a Mitzvah is done by rote, the שטן combats and is willing to sully and discredit that which we've done. But if a Mitzvah is performed with passion and excitement, the you is afraid to be משטין and denigrate our actions, for the more he attempts to defame us, the more Mitzvos we garner. Knowing this stumps the מקטרג and he can no longer be מקטרג. For this reason Rashi emphasizes that the wou hears how we are and cherish the Mitzvos. This is precisely what stymies the !!

As we enter this new year, תשע"ח, let us undermine the שט's ability. Let us embrace Torah and Mitzvos. Let us infuse our every Tefila with fervor. Let us be enthusiastically immersed in our learning. Let us saturate our every Mitzva with emotion and meaning. If and when we do this, the chief detractor will have NO say in the Heavenly court. Our allegiance to Hashem, steeped in passion will be the foundation of our relationship with Hashem.

Say It With Chumros

The forty days from the beginning of Elul through Yom Kippur Our Rabbis tell us that the word "Elul" is an acronym for the correspond with the forty days during which Moshe beseeched Hashem to forgive Bnei Yisroel for the sin of the Golden Calf. Since Moshe was answered favorably, descending from Mount Sinai on Yom Kippur with the new set of Tablets, this time period is known as the "Y'mei Ratzon", a time when it is possible to rekindle our relationship with the Almighty.¹

Consequently, Chazal record that during this time a person should accept upon himself greater "chumros" - "stringencies" in his observance. Most perplexing however, is the fact that we do not find any requirement to continue with these observances commitments are required only at this time of the year. after the Yomim Nora'im. Performing these stringent acts during this time period only, appears hypocritical. What message are we relaying to the Almighty?

phrase "Ani l'dodi v'dodi li" - "I am for my beloved and my beloved is for me". These days are designated for focusing upon our relationship with Hashem. If a man were to bring his wife flowers daily, doing the same on their anniversary would not express his love for her. At times which are designated for expressing our true feelings for our loved ones, a form of expression different than that used year-round is required. Similarly, when expressing to Hashem our love and commitment to Him, we must go beyond our regular observance in order to effectively convey our true feelings. Therefore, additional
